Pope Francis views evangelization as a personal encounter with Jesus, centered on witness and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, rather than just doctrinal teaching. He stresses that evangelization requires consistency between what one believes and lives, and it begins with openness to Christ and goes out to the marginalized, embodying the "smell of the sheep". The process is fueled by the



joy of the Gospel, is not a form of proselytism, and requires the evangelizer to be in a constant state of conversion and growth.

Core principles of Pope Francis's view on evangelization

- A personal encounter with Jesus: The foundation of evangelization is a personal encounter with Christ, not a simple transmission of doctrine or morals. This encounter brings a new "horizon and direction" to life.
- Witness and the Holy Spirit: Evangelization is fundamentally an act of witness. It
 requires the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and without it, efforts can become mere
 proselytism or public relations. The witness must be consistent with one's actions.
- Embracing imperfections: Evangelizers do not need to be perfect to share the faith. As an example, he points to Matthew, a tax collector whom Jesus called despite his flaws.
- "Smell of the sheep": Evangelizers are called to be involved and take on the "smell of the sheep" by getting involved with and serving others, particularly the poor, the sick, and the overlooked, just as Jesus washed the feet of his disciples.
- Internal and external conversion: Evangelization is not just for others; believers must also be evangelized daily and undergo conversion themselves.
- Attraction to beauty: The beauty inspired by the Gospel can draw people in. A life
 lived with a devotion to true beauty can be a powerful part of evangelization.


